Selectboard News and Notes



During the public hearing for a Community Development Block grant application (April 12), the Selectboard outlined how the funding (up to \$100,000) would help support the proposed modifications to address the **Town Hall ADA accessibility issues.**

The modifications include:

- Installation of a 3-stop lift
- Installation of a ramp to provide stage access
- Installation of two accessible bathrooms in the basement
- Grading to divert water from seeping into the basement
- Repair of the foundation due to water damage

After discussion and questions from the Wheelock residents who attended, the Selectboard unanimously approved the resolution authorizing applying for the grant. If the application is successful, a grant will be awarded at the end of the summer. Construction likely wouldn't begin until May 2024, with a proposed completion date of December 2024. The Selectboard was encouraged to seek funding to support a "clerk of the works" and a grants administrator for the project.

Cemetery Task Force: At their regular meeting on 4/18, the Selectboard appointed volunteers Liz Muckerman, Wendy Tidhar, and Patti Baker to the town's Cemetery Taskforce for 1-year terms and approved their work plan.



The work plan includes activities to assess, improve, and protect town-owned cemeteries and grave stones. The town is supporting the purchase of flags to mark stones level with the ground, and tools and supplies for cleaning stones.

A survey and fence repair project is planned for the Sulfur Springs cemetery. Large stone repair and repositioning will be provided by Jonathan Perkins (prioritizing the Village Cemetery). The Taskforce will also set out flags for Memorial Day; local volunteers know where to place them and the sexton collects them after Veterans' Day.

There's no time like the present to learn more about Wheelock's past.

The Historic Markers... Where Are They Now?

A year before his death, **Ferdinand (Ferd) Chase** (1840-1917), placed 25 stone markers around town commemorating important places and people.

*"After the Civil War, he clerked in a store, worked in a railroad office, and finally established a hotel at Loon Lake, N.Y. This became a very successful enterprise and afforded him the means to further his interests in the history of his native town. His gifts to the town of Wheelock included the soldiers' monument; the grindstone monuments to soldiers of the Revolution and War of 1812; and 25 historical markers throughout the township."***

The 1975 Town Report featured 15 markers, which probably generated new interest. In 1976, **Janet Smith** tracked down 20 of the markers listed in ****E.J. Hutchinson's** town history (1961).

Barnard Hoyt District Schoolhouse *"later known as the Peak District. Located just east of the John Rock crossroads on TH3 (town highway). It was moved to the Village in the late 1940's to serve as part of the town garage."*

In Honor of Horace Goss *"who constructed the Mountain Road to Stannard, & is located near the high point of this road."*

The Town Pound a place to detain stray domestic animals. Wm. H. Jones lifelong pound keeper, erected 1796. *"Above the Red Schoolhouse on TH27. Later 'pound keeper' was bestowed on newly wed men as they were quite apt to be called out at all hours to detain stray animals!"*

NEK Broadband Project Update

With the last of the snow and warmer days, the NEK Broadband's work schedule is picking up speed.

Finding sufficient workers to install all the fiber for this huge 45-town project has been challenging. The goal is to hire all the necessary workforce from the NEK.

In response Vermont Tech and the Vermont Department of Labor are collaborating on a **free apprenticeship program and one of the sites will be in the NEK this spring!** The program combines classroom learning and hands-on work.
