A Neighbor Helping Her Neighbors

When Beth Norris retired from her faculty position in the Music and Business Industry program at NVU

Lyndon, her husband Kris gave her a gift of a long arm sewing machine for her quilting projects. When the Covid-19 pandemic hit, she felt that more people would wear a face mask if they had easy access to them. Beth had a "stand in the shower" moment of inspiration on how she could apply her sewing skills to help reduce the spread of the virus.

Her daughter Kate was enlisted early into the project. They figured out a way to grid out over 100 masks at a time. Using polyester king-size sheets for the liners and quilters' cotton for the outer layers, they set to work sewing and steaming the fabric. Lengths of narrow clothesline rope form the ties and that's the job of her grandchildren Ella and Johnny.

Beth has commercial orders for masks, such as 560 for the Koffee Kup Bakery, but locally **she provides simpler masks for free** at White's Market and Dollar General. They are posted with instructions on how to finish and adjust the mask to fit and a request to take **one per person**. Beth goes daily to add more masks and says: "I figure if I want to see change, the best thing I can do is offer a little solution."

Your Vote is Your Voice

Vermont has two upcoming elections, a primary on **Aug. 11 and the Nov. 3** Presidential and Vermont general election. Wheelock voters who do not want to vote in person have two voting options. You can **vote early** —ballots are available now at the Town Clerk's office—or **vote by mail**—request an "absentee ballot" either online at the Vt. Secretary of State's website or simply return the **postage paid postcard** you recently received in the mail. The postcard goes directly to our town clerk (yes, that is Wheelock's mailing address!).



Trash Talk

Vermont state law bans food scraps in the trash as of July I. Wheelock residents are members of the Northeast Kingdom Waste Management District (NEKWMD) where we can get advice and equipment for backyard composting (lots of options) or take advantage of the free drop-off for food scraps at either the transfer station (in the recycling space) or NEKWD in Lyndon.
