Jim Blackbird The Covid-safe voting process went smoothly. Voter turnout was better than expected; 115 votes



Town Hall Accessibility Project

It's well known that our Town Hall does not meet accessibility requirements. Several proposals made over more than a dozen years to address the problem have been unsuccessful at the ballot box. During the 2020 Town Meeting, voters learned this situation can no longer be ignored. The U.S. Dept. of Justice is requiring the Selectboard to provide a fully accessible Town Hall with construction to begin by 7/31/23. There is a lot of work to complete before that date.

After Town Meeting 2020 a volunteer 'Facilities Taskforce' was formed to address the task: Ryan Hanrahan (chair), Steve Amos, Eileen Boland, Jason DiGiulio, Enid Ellis, Shane Lanpher, Ann Lawless, and Hèlène Millas met 16 times from March to November. They considered all Wheelock's facilities, with a special focus on all the prior Town Hall proposals and made recommendations for next steps to the Selectboard.

With funding from the successful Municipal Planning Grant proposal, the Selectboard has contracted with experienced consultants for the technical assistance necessary for the project's next phase:

Paul Simon:VISCC LLC, project managerChristopher Kennedy:MAKE Architects, architectBrandy Saxton:Place Sense, outreach

Their work will be a two-step process. **Step One** provides two Town Hall conceptual options for comparison, as well as a concept for a new Town Garage that can be incorporated into either of the two Town Hall proposals. These two options will be presented to the town for a decision on which option is preferred. **Step Two** further develops the preferred option identified in Step One, and provides additional information necessary to proceed toward a bond vote.

A new volunteer Project Committee was formed to work with the consultants and to support the Selectboard: Steve Amos, Eileen Boland, Marc Brown, Enid Ellis, and Ann Lawless (chair); with Alison Low of NVDA providing advice. **More volunteers needed and welcome!**

All Wheelock residents can expect to receive an important mailing with project information and a survey this spring!
