

In other town business bid specifications will be drafted for repairing the roof of the Sulphur Springs Pavilion, as well as the town garage roof. The Town Hall facility use policy suspending use of the building will remain in place, not only due to Covid, but also for safety issues with the front door. Town Hall Accessibility Project Update

s reported in the March edition of The Miller's Run, Wheelock has hired a project team to help the town reach its goal of providing residents with a fully accessible Wheelock Town Hall meeting space and clerk's office.

We need to come together as a community to address these accessibility issues this year. The agreement with the U.S. Department of Justice requires us to have a firm plan of action by the end of 2020.

The project team consultants include **PlaceSense** for the outreach (communication) efforts, **MAKE** architects, and **VISCC** construction consultants as project manager. They are working closely with the volunteer project committee: Steve Amos, Enid Ellis, Marc Brown, Liz Muckerman, Ann Lawless, and Eileen Boland. A project website has been set up at http://placesense.com/wheelock/

This team effort represents a new approach to this long-standing problem. The Town has been successful in attracting grant funds to assist with these efforts*. Voters will receive accurate information and have opportunities to provide feedback and guidance to town leaders before they are asked to fund a major rehab or new construction.

At the beginning of April all Wheelock residents received a mailer (in a bright yellow envelope) with a summary of the long history of where we have been and where we going with this project. We encourage you to hold on to it for future reference. (If you have not received it, contact us by email, Facebook, or the phone number at the top of page 1.)

Next the group is working on a **community survey** to be mailed to all Wheelock residents at the end of April. (An online version of the survey will be available too.) Responses to the survey will help inform the design alternatives to be developed by the consultant team and presented at a **community meeting in late summer**.

Based on community preferences for a particular design of an accessible, code-compliant facility gathered at the summer meeting, the design team will refine that proposal with an estimated budget (no budget is final until a project has gone out to bid). Wheelock residents will be asked to vote on a proposal at Town Meeting 2022.

*Grant funders to date include: Municipal Planning Grant (VT Dept. of Housing and Community Development), The Smart Growth Fund (VNRC), NCIC, and VT Community Foundation (you could also say VT Community Foundation NEK Fund or VCF Northeast Kingdom Fund)
