heelock Town has hired Lucy Greenwood as Administrative Assistant and Dean Davis (formerly a member of the road crew) was promoted to the full-time year-round Highway Supervisor position.

Every town in the NEK Community Broadband, our local 40-town communications union district, has a representative and an alternate member. **David Stahler** is our representative and the Selectboard appointed **Steve Amos** as the alternate (these are volunteer positions).

With the passage of the **Federal "American Rescue Plan Act** (ARPA)", which includes a \$2.7 billion package of aid for Vermont, more than half is already appropriated to federal agencies, local governments, education institutions, and others, which leaves approximately \$1 billion for the state to expend over the next four years. Wheelock's allocation (based on population) is \$80,000. Guidance to towns on on how it can be spent will be forthcoming.

At their May meeting, the selectboards of Wheelock and Sheffield jointly agreed to research changing the Keniston and Dane Education Fund to a municipal entity, which would eliminate paying federal taxes, thereby ensuring more money for grants to students.

## **GOTHISTORY?**

There's no time like the present to learn more about Wheelock's past.

Early Wheelock settlers usually had family burial grounds; many disappeared from neglect or were abandoned. The first record of a **town cemetery** (April 8, 1793) was "near the center of town", however, there is no evidence of it today.

There are currently **nine cemeteries in Wheelock.** The all-volunteer **Cemetery Taskforce**, chaired by Paul Tomasi, has confirmed the town **owns and is responsible for five**: West Wheelock Cemetery, Sulphur Springs Cemetery, South Wheelock Cemetery, Drown Cemetery, and Village Cemetery.

The Taskforce is creating an inventory of conditions and needs for each. More volunteers for the project are welcome!

# Helping Households Connect to Broadband

he Federal Communication Commission's **Emergency** Broadband Benefit, helps families and households struggling to afford internet service during the COVID-19 pandemic. This benefit will provide a discount of up to \$50 per month towards broadband service for eligible households. Eligible households can also receive a one-time discount of up to \$100 to purchase a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet from participating providers if they contribute more than \$10 and less than \$50 toward the purchase price. This benefit is limited to one monthly service discount and one device discount per household. # **Town Hall Accessibility Project Update**

he Town Hall Accessibility Proposal Project continues throughout the 2021 calendar year. Some recent highlights:

• The Project Committee (volunteers and consultants) meets on the **second Monday of the month @6 p.m. (via Zoom)**. Meeting agenda and minutes are posted online and at the Town Hall.

• Project information is updated on a regular basis on the PlaceSense (consultant) webpage at <u>http://placesense.com/wheelock/</u>

• 80 Wheelock residents completed the recent **3-page survey** by the May 21st deadline (62 responded to the first brief survey in 2020)

• **Survey results are still being compiled and assessed**. Few survey statements garnered a clear majority on any statement (agree or disagree), but there was majority agreement that Wheelock needs an accessible meeting space that can accommodate up to 200 people.

• A **community meeting in the early fall** will be a forum to present proposals and discuss the first phase of work with Wheelock residents.
